

What is career mentorship?

Career Mentorship is a one-to-one relationship between an experienced professional (mentor) and a less experienced professional (mentee) to assist in their career progression.



Mentors provide guidance, support,

encouragement and inspiration to mentees through sharing their knowledge, skills and experience.

Mentees are given a unique

opportunity to build a trusting relationship with a leading professional from whom they can both learn and aspire.
