Initial study permit application outside Canada

Students who submit their complete study permit application before May 15, 2021, may receive a decision from IRCC by August 6, 2021. Please get details <u>here</u>.

Post-Graduation Work Permit (PGWP)

Students who completed their program from overseas may be able to submit a Post-Graduation Work Permit from outside Canada. Please get details <u>here</u>.

Please note:

• Students who applied to graduate by April 15, 2021 will receive a completion letter on the conferral date of May 28, 2021.

• You may need a valid job offer with a work permit approval to enter Canada while current travel restrictions are in effect.

Flights suspension from India and Pakistan

The Government of Canada issued a notice to suspend all commercial and private passenger flights from India and Pakistan for 30 days, effective 23:30 EDT on April 22, 2021. Please do not make any travel plans until this pause to travel is lifted. Please get details <u>here</u>.

IRCC Updates:

Please be aware of the latest <u>IRCC announcement</u> concerning international travelers arriving to Canada as of February 22, 2021. Per IRCC, all air travelers arriving in Canada "must reserve a room in a Government of Canada-approved hotel for three nights at their own cost and take a COVID-19 molecular test on arrival at their own cost." Please be prepared to include these costs and arrangements in your quarantine plan. Travelers are still required to provide their negative predeparture test.

Please note that Bow Valley College is a recognized institution with a COVID-19 readiness plan to assist our international learners. For those preparing to come to Canada, please ensure you review the <u>pre-arrival resources</u> page on our website.
