









## How to turn on Select to Speak on Android Phones/Tablets

**Note:** Please be aware that every phone/tablet is a bit different any may be running a different version of Android. These instructions are designed to help you find the right area to turn on Select to Speak, but the screenshots and instructions may be a bit different on your device.

## How to use Select to Speak on Android phone/tablets.

	<p>When <b>Select to Speak</b> is turned on a <b>speech bubble icon</b> will appear at the bottom of your screen.</p> <p>The <b>speech bubble</b> will remain on the screen unless you turn <b>Select to Speak</b> off.</p> <p>If you want to move the <b>speech bubble icon</b>, tap and hold your finger on the screen until you feel a slight vibration, then drag the icon around your screen.</p>
	<p>You can use the <b>speech bubble</b> to read aloud any text that you can tap on such as documents, emails, text messages, text on websites and text labels</p> <p>When you wish to hear spoken text, first tap on the <b>speech bubble icon</b>. The icon will change colour to indicate that <b>Select to Speak</b> is ready.</p>
	<p>Next, <b>tap an item</b> on the screen or <b>drag your finger</b> over the text to select it.</p> <p>The text will become highlighted and your text will be read aloud.</p> <p>Tap anywhere on the screen to stop reading.</p>
